
1. Ancient Architecture: Canterbury boasts historical buildings that date back centuries. Notably, the Westgate Towers, England's largest medieval gateway, which stands as a testament to its rich past. The Eastbridge Hospital, with remarkable architecture from 1190 and the partially preserved St Augustine's Abbey (dating back to 613 AD) offer glimpses into the city's history.

2. Stunning Cathedral: Canterbury Cathedral is a must-see. With parts dating from the 11th century, it's an awe-inspiring structure with Norman, Romanesque and Gothic architecture. As the city's top visitor attraction, it's well worth exploring.

3. Shopping Experience: While Canterbury exudes historical charm, it also offers modern shopping. Whitefriars, an open-air shopping centre, features popular brands, while the King's Mile area hosts numerous independent businesses, including jewellers, cafes and artisan shops.

4. Arts and Culture: The city celebrates the arts. The Marlowe Theatre, named after playwright Christopher Marlowe, hosts exciting shows, plays, and concerts.

5. Easy Access: Less than an hour from London by high-speed rail, Canterbury is an ideal year-round destination. Explore cobbled streets, historic buildings, award-winning vineyards and ancient woodland as part of our special learning experience.







WHAT DOES THE OET EXAM INCLUDE?

The occupational English test is broken into four sections. Each candidate is assessed on their skills in speaking, writing, reading and listening. See below for a summary of what you can expect in each section:

OET PREPARATION ADVICE

Working in the medical profession in a second language is challenging. To maximise your chances of passing the Occupational English Test the first time around, we highly recommend taking an OET preparation course with us here in Canterbury and enjoy studying in our iconic historic city.

OET Writing

OET Reading

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• The writing section of the Occupational English Test is specific to your medical specialism. However, the methods of assessment are the same across all disciplines.

• Candidates are given case notes and are then required to write a standard letter relating to the case. This might be a discharge letter, referral, or written advice to patients and carers.

OET Listening

- The two-part listening exam is the same for all candidates. The first section is a simulated patient consultation, on which the candidates are asked to answer shortform questions.
- In the second part, candidates listen to a longer presentation, before answering a series of multiple-choice questions.

OET Speaking

- Many candidates find the speaking element of the Occupational English Test the most challenging. In this section, candidates will act out a twenty-minute role play, with the examiner acting as a patient.
- This section is specifically designed to assess your ability to communicate verbally in the kinds of real-world scenarios you'll encounter as a healthcare professional.

 All OET candidates take the same two-part written exam. In the first section, candidates are asked to read short medical texts, before filling in missing words in a summary paragraph. The second section is a multiple-choice exam, based on a longer written text.


